A Note From the Rev. Marissa Krey Director, ELCA Fund for Leaders

Dear friends,

God's grace and peace to each of you, beloved saints, who make up the Fund for Leaders community!

Twenty-five years ago, in fall 1996, leaders of our church were busy preparing the case for establishing what we now know as the ELCA Fund for Leaders. Their goal was to present a compelling argument for a robust commitment to theological education at the ELCA Churchwide Assembly the following summer. Memos from this time argue that "the size of this effort should be dramatic and challenging."

The goal of supporting every candidate at an ELCA seminary continues to challenge us, but the impact of the Fund for Leaders can surely be called dramatic. In 2000 we awarded our first scholarships to just eight students, a proverbial "drop in the bucket" to be sure, yet with each award the effects ripple across our church. Now we add 50 or more new students to our Fund for Leaders community every year. When you include the large number of synodical scholarship recipients, **our Fund for Leaders Network of alums has grown to over 1,100!** What we have achieved together, nearly 25 years later, is truly miraculous.

This year, in addition to our 44 new full-tuition scholarships, we are celebrating impressive growth in both our mission developer and our federal chaplaincy ministry scholarships, with 15 new awards. Together, these two specialized funds represent not only more scholarship dollars distributed to students but also our church's commitment to supporting students who are called to many different types of ministries.

I hope you enjoy getting to know this year's class of scholars more personally throughout the pages of this book, and I want to share a few highlights of the class as a whole:

- For the 2021-2022 academic year, the Fund for Leaders will be supporting 317 candidates for ministry with **over \$3.2 million in scholarships!**
- The 59 students celebrated in this book come from 36 of the ELCA's 65 synods, and 19.6% are people of color or whose first language is other than English.
- Half of this year's students will be studying in distributed learning (i.e. long-distance) programs.
- The average age of this year's Fund for Leaders scholar is 32.5.

Over the years, some of our Fund for Leaders supporters have had the opportunity to meet students face-to-face at our annual celebration banquet, but many more have not. Though we miss being together, our online celebrations have been a true gift to members of our community who have never been able to travel to our banquet. For the first time, our entire community — students and their families, alums and generous supporters — can all be together. These last two years remind us that the thousands of saints who have made all this ministry possible could never fit into even the largest of banquet halls.

For each of them — for each of you! — I give thanks to God.

A warm hello to all my siblings in Christ,
