REFLECTING ON ACCOMPANIMENT

“... being convinced that God had called us to proclaim the good news to them.” —Acts 16:10

This text from Acts comes from the story of a missionary trip that does not go according to plan. Paul, one of the most successful missionaries of the early church, invites Timothy and Silas to join him as he speaks the word in Asia, but the Holy Spirit forbids them to go there. They try to go to Bithynia, but “the spirit of Jesus did not allow them.” Then a Macedonian man appears to Paul in a dream, asking for help. When the trio arrive in Macedonia, they go to a place of prayer, as is their custom on the Sabbath. Instead of finding the required number of males gathered for prayer, they find Lydia and her friends. The story closes with the conversion of Lydia and the baptism of her household.

We believe, as Paul believed, that our God is a missionary God. The ELCA Constitution describes us as “called and sent to proclaim God’s creative, redeeming, and sanctifying activity in the world.” We heed the command of Jesus in the Gospel of John: “As [God] has sent me, so I send you” (20:21). Sentness (the act of being sent) is the essence of being church, connecting us to the mission and to the one who sends. We are sent not only to engage in a task (the doing of mission) but as an expression of our life together as members of the body of Christ (the being in mission).

Mission rooted in relationship means growth – for everyone involved. In response to God’s liberating grace, we listen, learn and deepen our understanding of and love for one another. The ELCA organizes its global engagement around the theology and practice of accompaniment, walking together with Lutheran, ecumenical and interfaith siblings around the world. We are a church that believes God is calling us into the world – together.

The Spirit said “no” to Paul’s plan and instead led him to deliver the message Lydia needed to hear. As church, we want to create room to listen to the Spirit. From this directory you will discover some of the ways ELCA personnel around the globe are living out that goal by serving with our companion churches. I invite you to pray for them and perhaps identify a partner who might join you in conversation about the ways we all journey together in response to the “winds of the Spirit.”

We are a church that believes God is calling us into the world – together. The global work of the church can be characterized by the following values:

MUTUALITY	A commitment to relationships in which we receive one another’s gifts and expertise.
INCLUSIVITY	A commitment to relationships that address exclusion in communities.
VULNERABILITY	A commitment to relationships that are open to Christ’s transformation and reconciliation.
EMPOWERMENT	A commitment to relationships in which we build one another’s strengths and capacity for God’s mission.
SUSTAINABILITY	A commitment to relationships of accountability that steward God’s given gifts for the present and future.

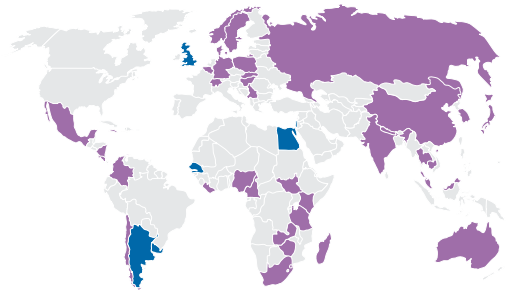

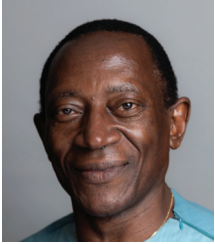

ASIA AND THE PACIFIC

A SNAPSHOT OF IMPACT

- **Eighteen missionaries** are serving in **five countries** in Asia and the Pacific in 2023.
- Nearly **\$1.5 million in grants** supported sustainable development throughout the region in fiscal year 2021.
- About **\$500,000 in direct mission and evangelism grants** was provided to churches in the region in 2021.

A SNAPSHOT OF IMPACT

- **Thirty-one mission personnel** serve in **12 countries** in Europe in 2023.
- The ELCA accompanies Lutheran church bodies in **over a dozen** former Eastern Bloc countries.
- **Eighty-five percent of ELCA World Hunger grants** in Europe support work with vulnerable populations, including Roma communities, refugees, asylum-seekers, and children and families living in poverty.

Since 1994, the ELCA and the Evangelical Lutheran Church of the Augsburg Confession in Slovakia have cooperated to welcome volunteer teachers to central Europe. The program welcomes 12-20 new and returning volunteer teachers to serve in Lutheran schools in several towns and cities. Unfortunately, because of the COVID-19 pandemic's impact on borders and travel, the ELCA was unable to send any new volunteer teachers in the 2020-2021 academic year. However, in August 2021 the program was able to welcome new volunteer teachers, who joined those about to return. 
