

## **ADVENT RESOURCES**





This season's Advent calendar and study guide from ELCA World Hunger invite you to prepare room in your home and hearth for yourself and your loved ones before going into the world to act on behalf of your neighbors. In a time of global suffering and anxiety, Richard Wilbur's hymn "A Stable Lamp Is Lighted" calls us to embrace the tension of the moment, the natural desire for a place of our own, and our call to care for the stranger:

A stable lamp is lighted whose glow shall wake the sky; the stars shall bend their voices, and every stone shall cry.

The simple act of making a hospitable, warm, cozy place — even in a stable — moves the sky, the stars and the stones to tremble.

ELCA World Hunger's seasonal packet has resources for creating a place of care, rest and reflection for you and your family so that you feel prepared to strengthen your community.

The Advent calendar evokes feelings of a welcoming hearth during the harsher months of winter. The activities inside start with a standing nativity scene, ready to be colored throughout the season. Alongside each day's craft activity, the calendar includes:

- Opportunities from ELCA Good Gifts to generously support the church's national and global work to end poverty.
- Everything you need to create "Stocking the Streets" bags for your unhoused neighbors.
- Scripture, prayers and hymns for seasonal reflection.

This season's ELCA World Hunger study guide provides reflection questions for engaging the brand-new ELCA World Hunger-produced short video documentary "Intersections: Justice Ministry With ELCA Partners." The video and study guide ask viewers to think differently about the root causes of hunger and poverty, making complex issues seem manageable through our collective action as the church.

We prayerfully invite your household and congregation to light your own stable lamp to warm you for your ministry under the starry sky and among the crying stones.





housing guide from ELCA World Hunger and ELCA Advocacy provides information and tools critical to accompanying neighbors who face housing insecurity.


This guide is perfect for experienced and aspiring advocates, congregations interested in developing housing ministries, and seasoned leaders looking for the next step in their ministry.



#### Truth and Healing Movement

The ELCA's Truth and Healing Movement is an opportunity for Lutherans to increase their understanding of our colonizing impact on Indigenous people in the past and present. There are opportunities to learn, raise awareness and impact hearts and lives across this church. We believe that the truth, and our knowing and embracing it, is the first step toward healing for all of us.



# Practice land acknowledgments

Commit to acknowledging that the land on which we live, work and worship is Native land, and to showing gratitude for our Indigenous neighbors who have cared and continue to care for the land. The ELCA's office of Indigenous Ministries and Tribal Relations offers a guide with language for land acknowledgments in bulletins, church signage, worship and online events.

# Engage with the repudiation of the Doctrine of Discovery

In 2016, the ELCA adopted a memorial to repudiate the Doctrine of Discovery, with a call to repent from the church's complicity in the evils of colonialism in the Americas and adopt the practice of accompaniment with Indigenous communities. Read about the history of the doctrine and discuss ways in which your congregation can repudiate it.

#### Listen to Native voices

In your congregation, watch past webinars on Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women Awareness Month, Indian boarding schools, powwows and the Land Back movement, and hear from Indigenous leaders in our church to learn more about the work of Indigenous ministries. Use this time to reflect on how you can get involved with the Truth and Healing Movement.



"Our dream with House of Prayer is that, yes, you can be a Native person and also be a Lutheran and also be connected to your culture — to be connected to many generations of teachings and cultural practices." —Patterson Yazzie, executive director of the Navajo Evangelical Lutheran Mission (NELM) in Point Rock, Ariz., the only Lutheran presence in Navajo Nation. NELM's ministries include the Navajo House of Prayer, an ELCA congregation; a prep school; a food bank; and a café offering free hot meals.

# "God's work. Our hands."

"God's work. Our hands." is an annual day of service to celebrate who we are as the ELCA — one church, freed in Christ to serve and love our neighbor. "God's work. Our hands." takes place in September, but the service projects can be performed year-round.

Service activities offer an opportunity for us to explore one of our most basic convictions as Lutherans: that all life in Jesus Christ — every act of service, in every daily calling, in every corner of life — flows freely from a living, daring confidence in God's grace.

As you plan your day of service, think about the needs of your community as well as the capacity of your congregation. You might also consider partnering with other congregations or social service organizations in the area.

Volunteer at a local food pantry.



Host a community food drive.

Pack meals for low-income families





Organize a letter-writing campaign to lawmakers, advocating for just policies.

As people go through the journey, they learn why families are fleeing from their homes and the obstacles they face in finding protection in other countries, including the United States. The Migrant Journey is an experience that congregations can use to learn more about the perilous journey that children and families make every day.




# VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL PROGRAMS

### Act 2Day 4 Tomorrow

Looking for an overnight program for youth or fun learning activities for people of all ages? Spend your next Sunday school series learning about the root causes of hunger around the world. This interactive overnight program brings youth together to understand the role they can play in eradicating hunger and poverty. As the group takes part in the spiritual practice of fasting during the event, they will explore questions of faith, hunger, hope and justice together.

### Generation Zero-Hunger

With your youth group or congregation, experience the challenges faced by a family in Nepal as they seek a sustainable livelihood. An interactive roleplaying guide offers a cast of characters, materials you should expect to use and setup instructions for the experience. Though this was modeled on the activity at the 2024 ELCA Youth Gathering, we encourage you to be creative and adapt it for your own purposes.



### Global Farm Challenge



The "Do-it-Yourself Field Experience" guide is intended to help you set up your own Global Farm Challenge interactive track, an opportunity for youth and adults to experience the challenges smallholder farmers face bringing their crops to market as they aim to produce enough profit for food and savings.
