ASH WEDNESDAY Gracious God, out of your love and mercy, you breathed into dust the breath of life, creating us to serve you and our neighbors. Call forth our prayers and acts of kindness, and strengthen us to face our mortality with confidence in the mercy of your Son, Jesus Christ.





Your generosity ensures that staff and students have clean. safe water at their

school in **Zimbabwe**. The school is located in a community that relies on reservoirs of rainwater for drinking and farming. When cracks appeared in the reservoir the school uses, the community came together to repair it with support from ELCA World Hunger. The community also extended

the reservoir and a dam wall to guarantee that the school has abundant water. Now the students have enough to drink, and they are using water to irrigate the school garden and learn about growing vegetables.

Saturday

Lack of access to safe water is one of the biggest challenges to

overcoming poverty. With the gift of a share of a safe water project (\$250), you can give a community the power to create change. A simple water well, spring box or other water point can provide as many as 500 families with access to clean, safe water.

This World Water Day, set aside time to pray for neighbors, near and far, who face water scarcity and water injustice, and give thanks for local leaders whose tireless efforts inspire hope.

A little over a year ago, Christine (name changed for privacy) was Tuesday staying in a women's shelter in rural

northern **Wisconsin**. Her life began to change when she got involved with the Welcome Home Program, supported by your gifts to ELCA World Hunger. Because housing and food insecurity are deeply intertwined, the program addresses both. With help from her Welcome Home caseworker, Christine found a place where she and her daughter could live, and a voucher for a food pantry and grocery store nearby helped her fill up her refrigerator and kitchen cupboards. Through your generosity, you are showing up for your neighbors who endure hunger and poverty around the world and right next door.


