Wilmus "Roger" Randolph III is a student at United Lutheran Seminary in Philadelphia, Penn., where he is pursuing a Master of Divinity with a concentration in Black Church Studies. He is a candidate for ordination in the Southwestern Pennsylvania Synod of the ELCA. Roger received both a Fund for Leaders (FFL) Full-Tuition Scholarship and the FFL Federal Chaplaincy Scholarship and is currently serving as vicar at St. Paul Evangelical Lutheran Church in Arlington, Mass., as their 41st vicar. He assists with the pastoral care of the community through preaching, teaching and helping with digital ministry. Roger is also a chaplain candidate in the Pennsylvania Army National Guard, temporarily working with the Massachusetts Army National Guard.

Roger's scholarship relieved him of a huge financial burden, but most significantly, it has connected him to a vast network of ELCA Fund for Leaders peers and colleagues around the country. Upon graduation and ordination, Roger hopes to serve as both a full-time parish pastor and part-time National Guard chaplain. He's also considering further education, with an interest in social work and clinical counseling.
