- 1170 born in Calaruega, Spain
- 1206 became itinerant priest, preaching against heresies and calling for clergy reform
- 1216 became the head of the newly founded Order of Preachers
- 1221 died in Bologna, Italy

Dominic believed that the clergy of his day needed to combat heresy, not by violence and condemnation, but by gentle and learned preaching and by exemplary lives of poverty and humility. As a friar rather than a cloistered monk, Dominic traveled widely, preaching and teaching. Dominic's spirit lives on in the Dominican Order of Preachers, "O.P.," a Roman Catholic order of clergy dedicated to learned study, persuasive preaching, and saintly living.

In art, Dominic is shown wearing the Dominican habit of white robe and black cope. Sometimes he is shown with a star at his forehead and, to designate his learning, holding a red-bound book. Because Dominicans were seen as watchdogs defending the flock of believers, and because of a pun on Domini canis (dog of the Lord), he is often pictured with a dog.

Arm yourself with prayer rather than a sword; wear humility rather than fine clothes. — Dominic





For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.


Communion

During communion, the assembly sings, as time allows:








