2. Creation Is Whimpering

Environmental Crises:

- Deforestation = Earth's lungs disappearing
- Ocean pollution and climate change = death of marine life, struggling communities
- The most vulnerable are hit hardest: poor communities, Indigenous peoples and island nations.

3. Climate Justice = Love in Action

- o Loving God and loving our neighbor must include caring for creation.
- o Environmental harm disproportionately affects those with the fewest resources.
- Stewardship and justice are inseparable in a faithful Christian life.

Scriptural Connections

- Genesis Humans are called to be stewards of the earth.
- Romans 8 Creation is groaning, waiting for renewal.
- Revelation 21 God's plan includes a new heaven and a new earth, restoration not destruction.
