

Worship Resource: Blessing and Sending for Public Witness

This order is adapted from Blessing and Sending for Mission (ELW Occasional Services for the Assembly, p. 159). This blessing and sending is intended for use when individuals or groups are sent from the assembly to participate in public witness through advocacy, protest, or solidarity actions as an expression of their baptismal faith. Such witness may take the form of persuasion, resistance, or accompaniment, depending on the occasion and context.

This order may precede the blessing and dismissal in a congregation's primary service, or it may be adapted and used independently. Singing may be used as desired, either around the scripture reading and prayers, or as the rite begins or concludes. A list of possible hymns and songs is provided.

Introduction

The leader addresses the assembly, adapting these words for the occasion. Beloved in Christ: In holy baptism, we are called to "[bear] God's creative and redeeming word to all the world" (*ELW*, p. 231). Today we bless and send these *siblings/co-laborers in the gospel/members of this assembly* as they go forth to embody that call through public witness.

Scripture

One or more of the following or another appropriate scripture passage may be read. A reading from Isaiah: Is not this the fast that I choose: to loose the bonds of injustice, to undo the straps of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke? Is it not to share your bread with the hungry and bring the homeless poor into your house; when you see the naked, to cover them and not to hide yourself from your own kin? Then your light shall break forth like the dawn, and your healing shall spring up quickly; your vindicator shall go before you; the glory of the LORD shall be your rear guard. Then you shall call, and the LORD will answer; you shall cry for help, and he will say, "Here I am." (Isa. 58:6-9a)

A reading from Micah: "With what shall I come before the LORD and bow myself before God on high? Shall I come before him with burnt offerings, with calves a year old? Will the LORD be pleased with thousands of rams, with ten thousands of rivers of oil? Shall I give my firstborn for my transgression, the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul?" He has told you, O mortal, what is good, and what does the LORD require of you but to do justice and to love kindness and to walk humbly with your God? (Micah 6:6-8)

A reading from Luke: When [Jesus] came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, he went to the synagogue on the Sabbath day, as was his custom. He stood up to read, and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to set free those who are oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." And he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant, and sat down. The eyes of all in the synagogue were fixed on him. Then he began to say to them, "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." (Luke 4:16-21)

Commentary and Prayer

Brief comments may follow about the form of public witness for which those being blessed will be sent.

The following or another appropriate prayer is said.

Blessed are you, O Holy One, for you formed us in love, claimed us in baptism, and set us free for lives of service and witness.

Strengthen us to fulfill the promises of baptism—to proclaim Christ through word and deed, to care for others and the world you made, and to work for justice and peace.

The leader continues with one or more of the following petitions, adapting as appropriate. Each reflects a distinct posture of public witness: persuasion (advocacy), resistance (protest), and accompaniment (solidarity actions).

Advocacy (e.g., visits to legislators, public testimony, letter-writing campaigns) Bless those who go forth to speak truth with clarity and courage. Let their words be reflections of your mercy, their cause be grounded in your justice, and their witness be a sign of your peace.

Protest (e.g., marches, walkouts, boycotts, nonviolent resistance, public confrontation of injustice)

Bless those who disturb the peace that protects the powerful.

Let justice roll through their voices and their footsteps,

and may their disruptive presence be a sign of your reign breaking into this world.

Solidarity actions (e.g., vigils, peace walks, accompaniment of vulnerable communities, mutual aid)

Bless those who accompany others with compassion.

Let their steadying presence be a shelter in weary places,

and their faithful witness be a sign of your solidarity with all who suffer.

The prayer concludes:

To you, O God,

Source of life, Companion on the way, Fire of the Spirit,

be all glory and praise, now and forever.

Amen.

The service concludes with the blessing and the dismissal.

Additional Notes

This rite affirms public witness as a faithful expression of baptismal vocation and a tangible participation in God's mission of justice, mercy, and peace. Modeled after Blessing and Sending for Mission, it provides language and structure for blessing and sending individuals or groups engaged in advocacy, protest, or solidarity actions. The prayers and petitions draw from a wide range of scriptural sources that lift up prophetic truth-telling, accompaniment of the vulnerable, and courageous confrontation of injustice. The rite may be adapted for various settings—within the Sunday assembly or as part of preparation for public events. The trinitarian doxology and scriptural options reinforce the conviction that the church's call to public witness is rooted in God's justice-making love, revealed in Christ and sustained by the Spirit.

Psalms and canticles may include the following.

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Rise up, O LORD; lift up your hand, O God; do not forget the afflicted. (Ps. 10:12)
This I believe—that I will see the goodness of the LORD in the land of the living! (Ps. 27:13)
(FS. 27.13)
Turn from evil, and do good, and dwell securely forever. (Ps. 37:27)
God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. (Ps. 46:1)
Let [the king] defend the needy among the people, rescue the poor, and crush the oppressor. (Ps. 72:4)
Can a seat of injustice be allied with you, one which frames evil into law? (Ps. 94:20)
O LORD, you provide vindication and justice for all who are oppressed. (Ps. 103:6)
[God] has brought down the powerful from their thrones and lifted up the lowly. (Luke 1:52)

Scripture readings may include the following.
